MEET ISABEL



Isabel Thornton has built her career around a simple belief: that every person deserves to have a safe place to call home and that the builders of our past got it right. As an affordable housing and historic preservation specialist, she has spent more than two decades turning that belief into tangible change. After years of working in communities across the country developing affordable housing, she turned her attention to her hometown of Roanoke, VA. When she saw families paying more than half their income for substandard housing, she recognized an opportunity hiding in plain sight: with targeted investment, Roanoke's historic buildings could offer stability and dignity to her neighbors that needed it most. That conviction became Restoration Housing.

What began as a one-woman effort has grown under Isabel's leadership into a full-fledged development and property management organization known for transforming long-neglected structures into high-quality, affordable homes. Her approach is refreshingly practical: start small, focus on impact, and reinvest where others have looked away. Each completed project may be modest in scale, but together they're reshaping families and neighborhoods one restored home at a time.

RESTORATION HOUSING'S MODEL



Restoration Housing takes a distinctive approach to affordable housing by reinvesting in the historic buildings that once anchored Roanoke's neighborhoods. Many of these properties - often distressed, long-neglected, and abandoned by absentee property owners - still hold the potential to meet today's housing needs if returned to safe, livable condition. As the national conversation increasingly turns toward increased density to expand affordability in walkable, mixed-use areas, Restoration Housing stands out for showing that these solutions already exist within the historic fabric of our cities and towns.

Restoration Housing's work is centered on neighborhoods that have seen decades with little public or private investment. While rents in these areas may be technically "affordable," conditions are frequently substandard. Restoration Housing fills a unique niche by pairing historic preservation with high-quality affordable housing development through a blend of fundraising, local foundation support, Historic Tax Credit syndication, and State and Federal housing grants. This scrappy combination of resources allows Restoration Housing to bring distressed properties back to life while keeping rents within reach for the families who need them most.

Isabel's expertise comes from a rare blend of academic training, professional experience, and lived insight. She has an extensive resume of public speaking, particularly on how past public policies and urban design principles have shaped our communities—and the role historic preservation can play in restoring under-resourced neighborhoods while maintaining long-term affordability. She has been invited to share this perspective at statewide conferences, preservation forums, community development summits, and university programs, where her emphasis on equity-centered reinvestment and practical preservation has earned strong praise.
